WHEREAS, the National Law Enforcement Officers Memorial Fund reported that 111 federal, state, tribal, and local law enforcement officers died in the line of duty in the United States during the year of 2025, an 80-year low; and

WHEREAS, it is important that all citizens know and understand the duties, responsibilities, and sacrifices of their Brazoria County law enforcement agencies; and

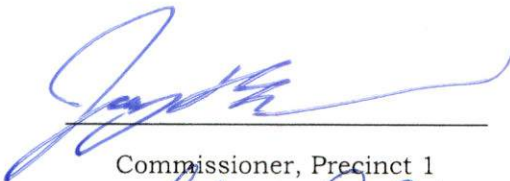
WHEREAS, the men and women of the law enforcement agencies in Brazoria County unceasingly provide this vital public service.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Brazoria County Commissioners Court does hereby retroactively proclaim May 10, 2026 to May 16, 2026 as

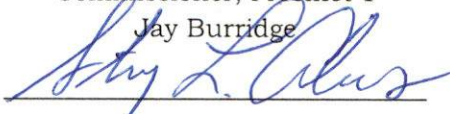

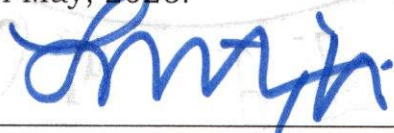
