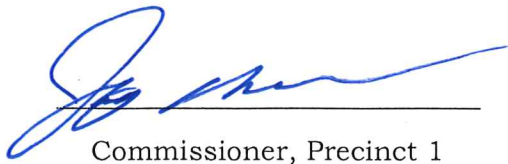

CAREERS IN CONSTRUCTION MONTH

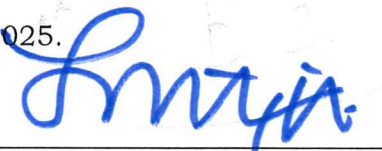
in Brazoria County, Texas. Together, we wish you great success with your scheduled events to give students a hands-on chance for exposure to the skills and trades much needed within our local industries.

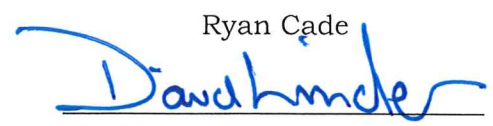
