

**FOR VOCA VICTIMS OF CRIME ACT FUND

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, The Brazoria County Commissioners Court finds it in the best interest of the citizens of Brazoria County, that the District Attorney's Office Crime Victims Assistance Program be operated for 2024-2025; and

WHEREAS Brazoria County Commissioners Court was not required to provide matching funds for fiscal years 2022-2024, that requirement has reinstated for fiscal year 2024-2025 for the VOCA Grant Application therefore the Commissioners Court will need to provide a 20% cash match for 2024-2025.

WHEREAS, Brazoria County Commissioners Court agrees that in the event of loss or misuse of the Criminal Justice Division funds, Brazoria County Commissioners Court assures that the funds will be returned to the Criminal Justice Division in full; and

WHEREAS, Brazoria County Commissioners Court designates Tom Selleck, Brazoria County's District Attorney, as the grantee's authorized official. The authorized official is given the power to apply for, accept, reject, alter or terminate the grant on behalf of the applicant agency.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that Brazoria County Commissioners Court approves submission of the grant application for the District Attorney's Office Crime Victims' Assistance Program to the office of the Governor, Criminal Justice Division.
