

“Vessel Turn-In Program”

Opportunity to Voluntarily Remove
Inoperable or Derelict Vessels

February 5 – February 8, 2024 - 8:00 AM – 5:00 PM

Brazoria County has partnered with the **Texas General Land Office (GLO)**, **Texas Parks & Wildlife (TP&W)**, and **Brazoria County Fire Fighters Association (BCFFA)** to offer county residents the opportunity to remove inoperable and derelict vessels through the “Vessel Turn-In Program.”

This program was designed to provide owners with a voluntary method of disposal. The **Texas GLO** and **TP&W** will verify that the vessel (boat) will qualify for disposal, **BCFFA** will sponsor the removal of all fuel, oil, and batteries, and **Brazoria County** will transport vessel to landfill for disposal. Vessels must be clear of waste and debris.

You are encouraged to participate if you own a vessel under 26’ feet long in need of disposal (longer boats may be accepted on a case by case basis) or know a neighbor who may need assistance. You will be required to bring vessel to one of the two drop off locations.
